ADMIN OVERSIGHT COMMITTEE CHAIR new Leadership Board Position

2 to 3 hrs/mth (excluding meetings)

CHAIR TASKS

- **Attend 10 meetings a year. (8 by ZOOM and 2 IN PERSON). Of course, we consider exceptions.**
- The Chair may, but is not required to, serve in one of the roles within the committee. (listed below)
- Meet with members between Leadership Board meetings to develop ideas, changes, and improvements.
- Keep the President updated on your progress.

ROLES within the committee. One person may be involved in one or more roles.

- VOLUNTEER COORDINATOR new
 - UPDATING FILES new
 - JOTFORM DESIGN: Creating forms for membership, shows, and more, with yearly updates to shows on JotForm Platform.
 - HISTORIAN
 - BRAINSTORMING TEAM on creating steady income
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VOLUNTEER COORDINATOR new 1 to 3 hrs/wk, until this gets organized.

- You will be given an existing EXCEL spreadsheet. **MAC USERS:** Remember to save file as EXCEL.
- You will receive notifications when a member joins or renews. Place the volunteer's interest on the existing Volunteer spreadsheet with their name/email/phone.
- When a specific need arises, contact those who have expressed interest in that need and see if they are still interested.
- Let the person in charge of that need (ie. Show chair, Community Event Organizer) and let them know who is available.
- Research incentives for having people EXCITED ABOUT SUPPORTING THE GUILD with their Time/Talents

This is a new role, so we will be making adjustments as needed.

HISTORIAN 1 hr/mth

- Put minutes, show info, and any other important items on the DRIVE
 - Digitalize old files
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DESIGN JOTFORM 5 to 8 hrs/**form** to Design | 2 to 5 hrs/**form** to Update

- We use the **JotForm platform** for all of our forms.
 - Once the form is created, yearly updates are needed to the Membership and Show forms.
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BRAINSTORMING TEAM ON CREATING A STEADY INCOME new ? hrs/?
